

A.5 Council meetings without a quorum

The Council may continue to meet as planned as if there were a quorum, but in such a situation the decisions taken must be ratified by a written procedure involving all members of the Council following that meeting. (EXCOM 24 February 1998)

Background

Council members and their Associations are expected to make the commitment to always attend planned meetings when nominated for election.

It is acknowledged that there will be meetings when not all representatives are present.

Because the meetings must continue as planned, they may do so without a quorum being present.

To ensure that the business of all the meetings is valid, the minutes shall be ratified by a written procedure to confirm by a majority vote the decisions taken by the meeting.
